Re-enrollment for Next School Year


Re-registration for Kingston Catholic's 2020-2021 School year.

### **Kingston Catholic School Required Summer**




The faculty of Kingston Catholic School believes that the love of reading begins during infancy and continues throughout one's life. Reading opens the window to children's imaginations and creates a vista to other experiences. Our goal at KCS is for students to read on a daily basis during the summer. The attached lists, created by teachers, are the books required for summer reading. Please find attached specific guidelines for each grade and directions for book reports. Book reports are due the first day of school or by the dates specified on Google Classroom for grades 6-8.

Students entering grades Pre-k through 1 are required to read for 10-15 minutes per day and parents initial the attached calendar on the days when your child completes the 10-15 minutes per day. Grade 2 is to read 3 books from the list and complete the attached graphic organizers. Grades 3 through 5 are required to read the mandatory book listed and then choose two free choice, and complete the attached graphic organizers — a different one for each book.

Students entering grades six through eight are required to read one *mandatory* book and then select one book from the list. The format for book reports will be posted on Google Classroom by July 1st. Each book report will count as a homework assignment and the two marks will also be averaged together for an ELA quiz grade. All work is due on the first day of school unless otherwise stated.

Please be aware that late work will not be accepted.


